



Your Right To Choose An Ambulance Service

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United States and Michigan law give you the right to choose an ambulance service. Michigan's "Patient Bill of Rights" requires a hospital, health facility and ambulance service to give you the right to request a change in services "free from restraint, interference, coercion, discrimination, or reprisal." MCL 333.20201. The "Patient Bill of Rights" also gives you the right to be involved in planning how you are discharged from a hospital, if appropriate. The United States Social Security Act also provides social security recipients with a "Freedom of Choice" to choose health care services from any qualified institution, agency, or person that will agree to provide such services. 42 U.S.C.A. § 1395a(a). In addition to your right to choose, a health care professional can not require you to receive services from another business in which that professional has a financial interest. MCL 333.16221(e)(iv)(A).
